WELCOME TO THE NEW CITY MANAGER

The City of Ferndale is thrilled to welcome Colleen O'Toole as the new City Manager. After a stringent national search effort between City Staff and City Council—including several rounds of researching, surveying, interviewing, and discussion—City Council unanimously appointed O'Toole at the Monday, February 10, 2025, public meeting.

O'Toole brings 8 ½ years of City Manager experience to Ferndale with a concentrated focus on finance, economic development, and capital improvement.

Her previous positions include the City Manager for Saline, Michigan, and Durand, Michigan. She is familiar with BS&A, the City's budget tool, and has extensive grant research and writing experience. O'Toole's job experience and personal values align perfectly with the wants and needs of the City of Ferndale.

O'Toole is no stranger to government operations, having grown up with two parents as civil servants. Throughout childhood, she witnessed community commitment and learned how an active participant solves community challenges. After receiving her master's in public administration from DePaul University in 2009, she pivoted from the public to the private sector to pursue that community-driven focus. She feels a sense of accomplishment knowing her job helps other people.

O'Toole's immediate priorities for the City are tackling the upcoming May election and Headlee Override Proposal, the fiscal year budget cycle, and the upcoming union negotiations. "I am here to help ease the community's concerns during a sensitive time and ensure that we are making the best use of our tax dollars," stated O'Toole. "I hope to advocate for residents and your experience in this community, and I want to see Ferndale continue to thrive." She shared that her goal is to protect and steward the community's quality of life in the years ahead.

When asked why she chose the City of Ferndale, she mentioned that Ferndale stood out more than any other community for its policies, activities, and inclusiveness. "Ferndale acts on its values, not just speaks," O'Toole noted. She sees the public, staff, and Council aligned on these values. Colleen is especially excited to bring her wife and kids to the community to experience Ferndale's unique events, diverse businesses, and inclusive parks.

O'Toole also cited the positive impression of the interview process from City staff, City Council, and the public, for teaching her the core values of the community. While discussing the appointment decision, City Council praised O'Toole for her experience, preparedness, and detailed approach.

FERNDALE HEADLEE OVERRIDE 2025

WHAT IS THE PROPOSAL?

On Tuesday, May 6, 2025, Ferndale voters will be asked to renew the voter-approved 2015 Property Tax Proposal.

- This renews the City's authority to levy 5.4452 mills for operational funding that would otherwise expire in December 2025.
- This is 1.1644 mills above the 2024 voted millage rate.

WHAT IS THIS PAYING FOR?

The expiring millage makes up approximately 14% of the funds that pay for essential services like **Police, Fire, and Public Works**. These services make up nearly 60% of the City's General fund. This funding will allow the City to maintain and improve these essential services for the residents.

HOW WOULD THIS IMPACT MY PROPERTY TAXES?

For 90% of single-family, residential property owners in the city, the impact is expected to be between approximately \$70 and \$175 per year. For more information on how to calculate your individual tax impact, please visit the City's website.

HOW HAS THIS CHANGED SINCE NOVEMBER?

INFRASTRUCTURE UPDATES

ROADS

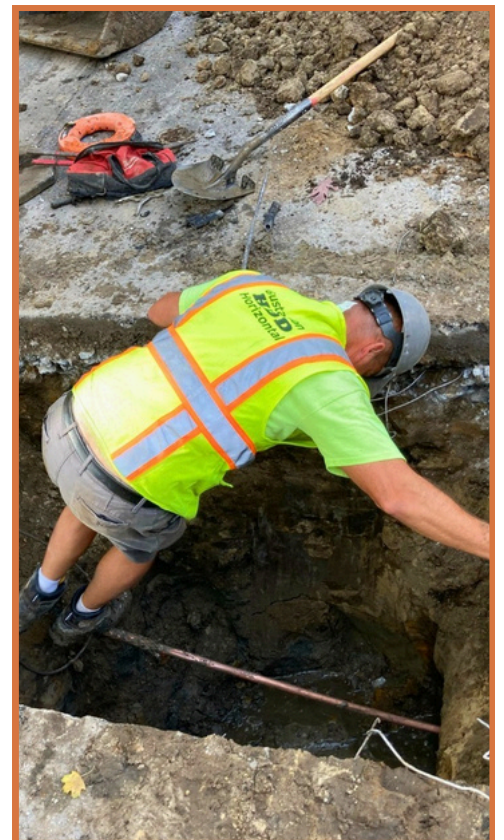
Each year, DPW oversees the repairs and surfacing of roads and streets. 2025 marks the final year of the ten-year 2015 Road Bond—a plan implemented to replace all residential streets. View the schedule of the remaining streets at bit.ly/ferndaleconstructionschedule.

WATER AND SEWER

The Water Main Improvement Program continues this year with water main replacements in the areas of Mahan, Brickley, and Shevlin (between Lennox and Chester). The City also addresses sewer mains with the Sewer Improvement Program, a project that ensures the sewers can move sewage and prevent basement backups. Last year, the City lined approximately 8,000 linear feet of older pipe guided by the results of the 2024 Sewer Televising Program.

LEAD SERVICE LINE REPLACEMENTS

The lead service line replacements are on schedule. 2,100 lines have been replaced thus far—this year, DPW is anticipating another 500. Residents can help expedite the construction process by reporting their home's plumbing materials through the self-reporting tool. DPW is thankful to those who have helped get the word out. YARD WASTE

Yard waste season begins on Monday, April 7, 2025, and runs through Friday, December 19, 2025. Please put your grass clippings, leaves, small sticks, and weeds in a labeled-reusable container or a brown kraft bag. Labels are available at the DPW yard or Ferndale City Hall. Yard waste is collected on your regular trash day.

SUSTAINABILITY

RESIDENTIAL COMPOST PROGRAM

The spring is the perfect time to sign up for the residential compost drop-off program. Reduce the amount of waste sent to landfills, the level of greenhouse gas emissions, and the number of rodents and pests near your trash while turning your food scraps into healthy soil. Compost food scraps, coffee grounds and filters, meat, bones, eggshells, and BPI-certified products. Do not include pizza boxes, plastic bags or packaging, non-BPI labeled compostable products, and produce stickers. Sign up at bit.ly/ferndalecompost, bring your food scraps to one of the six drop off locations, and rinse and repeat.

SPRING CLEANING

If you're refreshing your wardrobe this spring, consider how much you buy and whether it is second-hand. The fabrics you choose and how you discard them makes a big environmental impact. Clothing made from 100% natural fibers like cotton, hemp, or wool is easier to recycle—unlike synthetic blends that persist in landfills for hundreds of years. You can also consider repairing clothing or repurposing items before donating. Thank you to the Ferndale Environmental Sustainability Commission (FESC) for this information.



FREE WILDFLOWER SEEDS

Ferndale is in bloom! The FESC worked with Oakland County Parks and Recreation and the Oakland County Cooperative Invasive Species Management Area to create a wildflower seed mix for Ferndale residents to support ecosystems and pollinators, assist stormwater runoff, and enhance biodiversity. 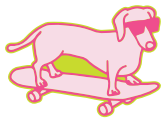
- Wilson Park: 1:00 p.m. for bunnies 1-4 years old

WHAT'S NEW AT OUR PARKS?

HARDING PARK

We're so excited about Harding Park! The Parks and Recreation Department was awarded a \$100,000 Land & Water Conservation Fund Grant from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources to help renovate the in-line rink at Harding Park. More details are coming soon.

WILSON PARK

Wilson Park is ready for spring! The Wilson Park Improvement Project is officially over and open for all visitors. Enjoy the new pavilion, playground structures, walking path, drinking fountain, landscaping, trash and recycling bins, and benches. Thank you to the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, Oakland County, the Ralph C. Wilson Foundation, the American Academy of Dermatology, and America in Bloom by CN.



There's no need to chase your tail—get a dog park membership! Wilson Park's Dog Park is the oasis for our four-legged friends, complete with safe key card access, fenced play areas for dogs of all sizes, sitting areas, water stations, waste pickup stations, urine-resistant shrubbery, and more. An annual membership is required by completing a one-time dog safety course, submitting the Dog Park Membership Application, providing updated vaccination records and licensing information, and paying the \$40 application fee (\$65 for pups from different cities). MARTIN ROAD PARK

The planning process for the Martin Road Park Service Building is underway. This facility will be a vital support hub for the park with ADA-accessible and family restrooms to accommodate the Splash Pad and other park activities. There will also be a concession stand and essential storage space. The tentative construction schedule is late 2025 with an anticipated completion in fall of 2026. Stay tuned for more updates.

Make a splash at the Martin Road Park Splash Pad this spring and summer from Friday, May 23, 2025, until Labor Day, Monday, September 1, 2025. Bathrooms will be open from mid-May until early October.

MAY 6, 2025, ELECTION

The Tuesday, May 6, 2025, Election will see two items on the ballot—a City of Ferndale Headlee Override Millage proposal (all precincts) and a Ferndale Public Schools Bond proposal (precincts 1-5).

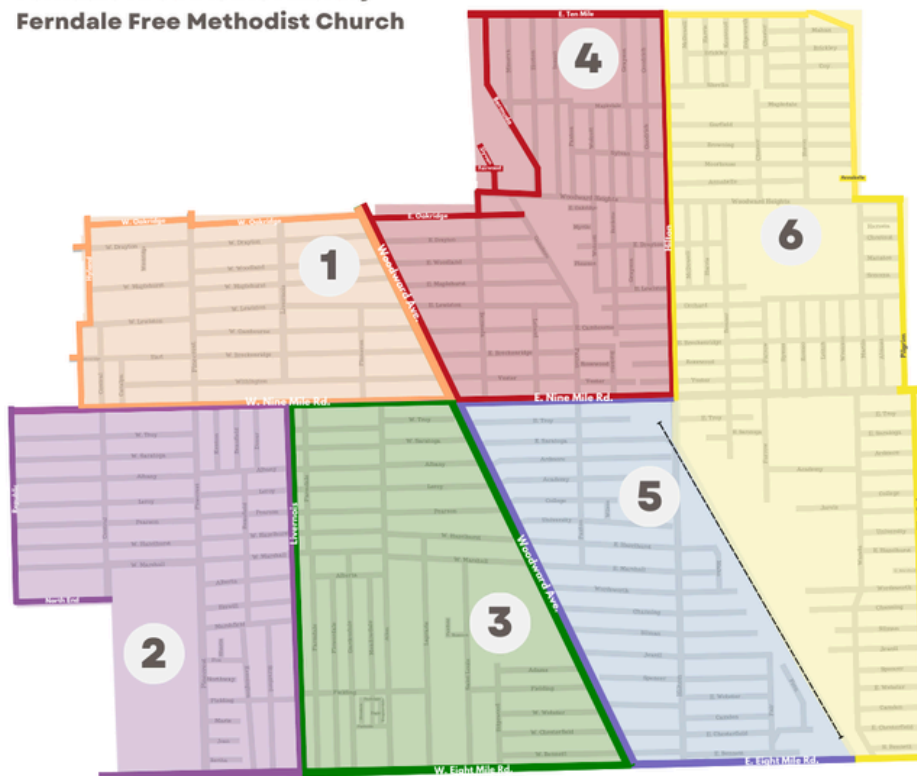

RUNNING FOR CITY COUNCIL OR MAYOR

The City of Ferndale's General Election on Tuesday, November 4, 2025, will include one Mayoral and two City Council positions. Each candidate must be at least 25 years old, a United States citizen, and a Ferndale resident since Saturday, November 4, 2023, or longer. Interested candidates must collect and return 100-150 verified signatures from registered Ferndale voters on official nominating petitions. Those interested in running for a position can retrieve a candidate packet from the City Clerk's Office at City Hall during normal business hours. The deadline to file the nominating petitions and Affidavit of Identity is Tuesday, July 22, 2025, at 4:00 p.m.

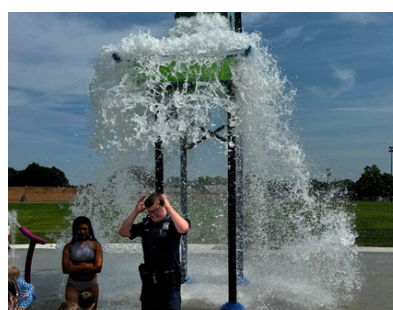
