PUBLIC WORKS

TRASH AND RECYCLING DELAY

The following holiday impacts weekly curbside garbage and recycling collection:

• Labor Day, Monday, September 1, 2025

There will be no pickup on September 1, 2025, so please set your containers out one day late for the rest of the week.



YARD WASTE

Yard waste is collected on your regular trash pickup day through the week of Monday, December 15, 2025. Please put your grass clippings, leaves, small sticks, and weeds in a labeled, reusable container or a brown kraft bag. Labels are available at the DPW yard or Ferndale City Hall.

CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY

ROADS AND SIDEWALKS

LEAD SERVICE LINE REPLACEMENTS

DPW is proud to report that 2,100 lead service lines have been replaced since 2021. There are still about 6,000 unknown lines in the system, so we need your help with this crucial step.

The City has created a self-reporting tool to allow residents to identify the service material inside their homes. Please fill out the survey and attach a few pictures of your meter. Visit **bit.ly/ferndalelsl** for the self-reporting tool and other lead service line information. This will help DPW understand the system and overall lower the cost of the program to ratepayers, like you!

STREET SWEEPING

Keep your eye out for the street sweeper over the summer. Street sweepers pick up loose debris on the streets to keep them clean and prevent clogged drains and flooding. If you see it around, please move your vehicle to give drivers a clear path.

RAINWATER AND FLOODING

The Kuhn Water Retention and Treatment Basin is the City's combined stormwater and sewer system. The system handles typical running water, flushing, and average rainfall, but when the rain pours, it can get overwhelmed. Not to mention, the effects of climate change have made rainfall more unpredictable. This can lead to flooding—but regular maintenance makes this less likely to happen.

As a reminder, the drain in your home is your responsibility. While the City does our part to maintain sanitary stormwater infrastructure, there are a few things you can do at home to protect your sewer line. Roots are the most common culprit of a clogged drain, but it also helps to be mindful of what you flush. If you do experience a basement backup, use water sparingly until the problem is resolved. Any additional water in the system may end up in your basement.

STORM CARE PROCEDURES

Preparing for severe weather events is critical. Here's what to do if a summer storm pours down:

- 1. If there are water backups in your area from heavy rain, let DPW know via **SeeClickFix**, or call the DPW front desk at **248-546-2519**.
- 2. If backups occur after normal operating hours, call the Police Department's non-emergency line at **248-541-3650**.
- 3. MOST IMPORTANT: Do not approach downed power lines. Call the Fire Department and let the professionals handle it safely.
- 4. For any emergency, always call 911.





Invasive species watch! Are you familiar with the tree of heaven? It's a notoriously invasive tree/noxious weed that is difficult to get rid of, causes property damage, and worsens seasonal allergies. The tree of heaven grows rapidly, crowds out other species, and can give off an unpleasant odor. According to Penn State University, to permanently remove this invasive species, target the roots with systemic herbicides applied in mid-to-late summer (July to onset of fall color). RESIDENTIAL COMPOST PROGRAM

Register for the free program at **<u>bit.ly/3X4LQ14</u>**. Collect food scraps in a container of your choice. Empty your container regularly into the green compost carts at any of the six locations throughout the City. (Consider emptying it more in the summer months.) Bring your container home, rinse, and repeat.

The City's free Compost Drop-Off Program is a great way to give back to the Earth. Composting turns food into healthy soil, and also reduces greenhouse gas emissions and the amount of waste sent to landfills. Plus, you'll have fewer rodents and pests lingering around your trash cans.

When in doubt, throw it out! Please do not include contaminants such as:

- Pizza Boxes (this is different than pre-2024 policies)
- Plastic grocery bags or plastic packaging
- Compostable products not labeled as BPI-Certified compostable. This includes products that may be labeled as compostable or have other compost certifications, such as TUV Austria.
- Produce stickers

The City of Ferndale's General Election on Tuesday, November 4, 2025, will include one Mayoral and two City Council positions. Each candidate must be at least 25 years old, a United States citizen, and a Ferndale resident since Saturday, November 4, 2023, or longer. Interested candidates must collect and return 100-150 verified signatures from registered Ferndale voters on official nominating petitions. Those interested in running for a position can retrieve a candidate packet from the City Clerk's Office at City Hall during normal business hours. The deadline to file the nominating petitions and Affidavit of Identity is Tuesday, July 22, 2025, at 4:00 p.m. The City Clerk's Office recommends turning packets in 1-2 weeks early for the verification process. Please return the completed form to the City Clerk's Office.

FINANCE

PROPERTY TAXES

Summer property taxes become available on Tuesday, July 1, 2025. Paper bills should arrive to taxpayers by the second week of July. If you have not received yours by Tuesday, July 15, 2025, please email **taxbilling@ferndalemi.gov** to request a copy. Beginning Tuesday, July 1, you can view your balance due, see detailed tax information, and print a copy of your tax bill through the BS&A online portal.



If you qualify for the installment plan, you will automatically receive coupons in the mail. The first installment is due Thursday, July 31, 2025. You can pay online, by mail, by phone, or at City Hall. Phone payments must be made in full—installments or partial payments cannot be made by phone. Specific instructions for each payment method are printed on the back of your tax bill and can also be viewed at **bit.ly/ferndalepropertytaxes.** Installment payments that are not made by the full date on the coupon may be subject to interest accrual.

JULY BOARD OF REVIEW

The 2025 July Board of Review will be held on Tuesday, July 22, 2025, at 9:00 a.m. in City Council Chambers at City Hall until business completes. This meeting will be held in accordance with the Open Meetings Act. The July and December Boards of Review have authority stated in MCL 211.53b. The authorities are different for the March Board of Review, where appeals over an opinion of value are only heard. Please email **assessor@ferndalemi.gov** for questions.

NEW BSA PORTAL

The City has transitioned to a new and improved, modernized BS&A payment system that offers smoother transactions, a user-friendly experience, and elevated customer service. This operates the same as the previous system, with a few added upgrades and tweaks.



The City still accepts payments online, by phone, dropbox, or inperson with cash, physical checks, e-checks, debit and credit cards and now, Google Pay and Apple Pay!

Those currently enrolled in Point and Pay auto-pay can make a one-time payment and re-register for autopay at **bsaonline.com/?uid=512.** Those who are not enrolled in autopay do not need to make changes at this time.

- 1. **True or False:** Residents must have a permit in order to have a backyard fire.
- 2. True or False: Fireworks are allowed every weekend in the summer.
- 3. True or False: The Fire Department can fill up a backyard pool for residents.
- 4. True or False: Residents can receive a free home safety inspection from the Fire Department.
- 5. True or False: Hot coals can be thrown away while they're hot.
- 6. True or False: Grills are one of the leading causes of summer fires.



ANSWERS

Let's see how you did!

- 1. **True:** Residents must have an Open Burn Permit to have a backyard fire. Review the safety guidelines and visit **<u>bit.ly/ferndaleopenburnpermit</u>** to fill out an application.
- 2. False: Fireworks are only allowed on select days and times. This summer, fireworks are allowed from Sunday, June 29, 2025, to Saturday, July 5, 2025, until 11:45 p.m. They are also allowed on the Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Labor Day until 11:45 p.m. Please call the Police Department's non-emergency line at 248-541-3650 if fireworks are being used outside of the dedicated days/times.
- 3. False: The Fire Department does not fill up pools.
- 4. **True:** The Fire Department offers free virtual home safety inspections for the exterior and interior of your home. Please complete the inspection form at **<u>bit.ly/ferndalehomesafetyinspection</u>**.
- 5. **False:** Hot coals should not be disposed of while they are hot. Please consider re-using coals, but if not, please go to a local hardware store and buy dedicated bins to cool them down. Once they are cool, they can be disposed of in the trash.
- 6. **True:** Grills are one of the leading causes of summer fires. Please keep your grill away from your home, garage, deck, trees, and similar structures, as well as children and pets. Never leave your grill unattended. Gas grills should be lit while the lid is open. If there is a gas smell, immediately move away from the grill and call the Fire Department.

• Grass and weeds enforcement runs until Friday, October 31, 2025. No grass or weeds can exceed seven inches in height.

- Outdoor storage for residential use should not exceed thirty-six square feet on the premises, should only be located in the back yard, and should not be located within any required side yard or rear yard set-back for the property.
- Garbage cans should be stored at the rear of the house. Trash should be stored in solid waste containers with water-tight covers.
- Properties should have visible address numbers from the street for first responders/safety officers.
- All rental properties in the City of Ferndale are required to be registered with the City and inspected. If you own and/or live in a rental property, and have not had a City inspector out to your property, please contact City Hall.
